Successful (Building Character)

- Develop personal growth through PSHE, assemblies and nurturing pastoral care
- Ensure that the children are developing their physical fitness as part of supporting their mental wellbeing
- Develop skills to access a broad range of subjects across the curriculum to create independent and adventurous learners
- To promote high aspirations and for all children to achieve their very best
- Provide opportunities to explore and develop high standards of personal behaviour and positive caring attitudes towards other people

Belonging (Social Justice)

- Enrich the curriculum by providing theme days, visitors, trips and residential in all year groups to bring the curriculum to life, foster creativity and link classrooms to real world experiences
